

Grade 1 made a Remembrance Day Quilt to honor our Veterans.





Literacy Focus: December and January

Writing assessments from **Whole School Write** showed there are students who have ability to achieve grade level expectations this year. *Great pre-writing practice work occurred in our classrooms!* Many students, however, will need directed, ongoing focus to build pre-grade developing skills towards expressing ideas in an organized way, with well-constructed sentences, using more specific word choices. In future writing tasks, parent support to edit and rewrite would be amazing! Please discuss with your child's teacher how you can be a key part of this growth. Being in class daily and task completion are the first goal to set with your child. *Literacy Lead support*, while limited, is available. Best immediate writing help is after-school workshops. Please express your interest to Laurel Young, ext. 1934, or via email.

To encourage child-family interaction in an engaging event, an ABC Book Project will run from December 9th to January 17th. The goal is to write a personal or family ABC book to be celebrated at our school *Family Day Literacy Event* on January 27th.


